Please join us on the afternoon of April 4th as Harvard visiting scholar, historian, and professor KRISTIE MACRAKIS adds a new dimension to our understanding of the Stasi, the East German Ministry for State Security, by bringing the topic into the realm of espionage history and exiting the political domain. Macrakis recreates the Stasi's secret world of technology through biographies of agents, defectors, and officers, and by visualizing James Bond-like techniques and gadgets, as she explores one of the most effective and feared spy agencies in history.



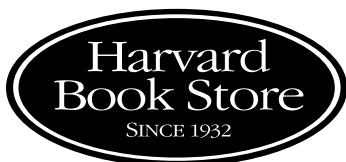
